General Admissions Information

Entry requires as a minimum 5 GCSEs of grade 5 or above including Maths and English in order to meet a basic academic standard - one which shows individuals can meet demands placed on them. Students on an A-level pathway will study 3 A-levels, with a fourth subject possible in **exceptional** cases. In line with our curriculum aims, we do not facilitate students studying solely one BTEC subject

While we aim to offer all of these subjects, please note the running of a course will ultimately depend upon sufficient levels of student interest and we may have to revise the curriculum offer in light of this.

North Learnington School Sixth Form is a local community school and will consider all applications from parents/carers who wish to send their children to this school. We will treat all cases on their own merits as we endeavour to offer the best advice and guidance to prospective students regarding the suitability of courses to

meet their needs and to ensure their success in the sixth form. Therefore in <u>exceptional</u> circumstances, students with a very good GCSE profile but who have not achieved either Maths <u>or</u> English at a Grade 4 at the <u>start</u> of the programme <u>may</u> be considered.

Any student securing <4 in either English or Maths GCSE will **not** be offered a place irrespective of their other GCSE results. In such cases where a student scores a 4 but not a 5 in either English or Maths and is offered a place, they will be encouraged to continue studying for the GCSE English or Maths at Grade 5+ via independent study and paying for a re-sit. This is to further their likely options post-18.

All qualifications on entry point must be GCSE/BTEC L2 or recognised as equivalents by the gov.uk (e.g. iGCSE) listing – irrespective of what companies who offer a service comparing qualifications from abroad with the UK say, this gov.uk list will be our referral point.
