Why do work experience?

76% of businesses say lack of work experience is the reason young people are unprepared for work

Work Experience aims to:

- give students a chance to see and experience the real world of work
- relate what students already know and have learnt in to a working environment
- enable students to develop confidence and work-ready skills
- build and develop a student's personal statement to help with applications for apprenticeships, college courses, University and employment in the future






When will this take place?

During the week Monday 13th to Friday 17th June 2022

Why then?

It has been timed to follow on from the careers education students will receive in Y10, which will include the writing of a CV and letter of application, and some interview practice. The dates have been chosen to avoid exams and assessments.







Who will find my placement?

The students themselves! But we will offer guidance and support if necessary.

Why won't the school find the placements?

So much of the learning will come from finding the placement for themselves. Employers are telling schools that they admire and respect students who are prepared to have a go for themselves. An approach directly from a student is more likely to get a placement than from the school doing it all.

How do students decide what to do?

- If they already have a career in mind, they might want to find something related to that.
- If they have no idea about a career, they should think about which subjects they enjoy, and consider going back to Fast Tomato, which they used in Y8, to try to identify some possible career paths.

Still no idea?

Experience of any work is better than no experience of work! It shows a future of work! It shows a future employer that students employer developed some have developed skills.



The Process

Students should ...

- Read through the Work Experience Guide in the information pack to get some advice and guidance about how to find a work experience placement students will have some time to do this with their learning mentor
- Return the completed and signed Consent Form 1 (Purple) to Careers office C044/Student Services by 12th October 2021
- When a placement has been found, complete Form 2 (Blue) and return it to us by 14th December 2021.
- It is the responsibility of the parents/carers and students to complete the risk assessment with the employer and return to school by 14th December 2021 (along with the blue form).



We cannot send students out on placement to anyone who does not have Employer's Liability Insurance. Sole traders or anyone who works for/ by themselves are unlikely to have this, but may be willing to take it out for the week concerned.

Additionally, it must be made clear to employers that the students are under the age of 16. Failure to do this could compromise the employer's insurance.

How can parents help?

- Encourage your child to read the information provided and help them to get started on their search. Friends/ relatives/employers might be able to help with this.
- Ensure your child meets the deadlines so that they understand the importance of being able to meet deadlines as this is a fundamental part of the working world
- Consider offering a placement to another student, if possible.
