How do I apply for an Apprenticeship?!



Applying for an apprenticeship can seem daunting, so we made this brief guide to help students reach their goal of obtaining an apprenticeship!

Applying for an apprenticeship is exactly like applying for a job. You need a CV, you apply online and you will attend an interview or/and an assessment centre.

Apart from Degree level Apprenticeships, <u>Apprenticeships can start at ANY TIME</u>, not just in August and September.

Do you have a CV?

Applying for an Apprenticeship is like applying for a job, you need a CV! Our advice is:

- Have one 'generic' CV which you can adapt to fit the different apprenticeships you are applying for
- Include a personal statement which states <u>WHY</u> you want to complete an apprenticeship
- Ensure you include SKILLS you have acquired while at school such as; Communication, flexible etc.
- Ensure you include any work experience with dates
- Include some hobbies at the end of your CV. Such as; walking, playing guitar, drawing, playing computer games etc.

Ensure you apply for the correct level!

Below are the apprenticeship levels which students can apply for.

Y11 Students should be aiming for Advanced level Apprenticeships

Y13 Students should be aiming for Higher and Degree level Apprenticeships

	Level	Equivalent educational level
Intermediate	2	GCSE
Advanced	3	A level
Higher	4,5,6 and 7	Foundation degree and above
Degree	6 and 7	Bachelor's or master's degree
