Year 13 History Curriculum Overview

Rationale: In Year 13, Paper 3 and the History NEA are covered. We use the Edexcel exam board. Lessons are geared towards the understanding and completion of exam questions, interpretations, sources and knowledge based questions. There are 5 lessons a week. The NEA is an independently produced essay of 3000-4000 words. The production of this is monitored across Year 13 with the final draft being submitted at the end of the Spring Term.

Autumn1	Coursework Students begin Year 13 with an opportunity to review their research that they have completed for their NEA over the summer holidays. Time is given in class for all students to individually work with their teacher to check their understanding of the task and the progress they are making. This is then reviewed periodically throughout the Autumn and Spring terms. NEA assessment will focus on the student's ability to identify and select relevant material and use this in their writing to sustain an overall judgement about a matter of historical debate. Students will be expected to analyse, explain and evaluate the differences in historians' views. They will then demonstrate their understanding by writing an essay of 3000-4000 words which will be submitted at the end of the Spring term. Introduction to Paper 3, including explanation of the division into Breadth and Depth aspects. Depth 1 - Britain and the French Wars, 1793—1815. Students will study the wars against the French both on land and at sea. Autumn 2	NEA: Students will have NEA Check-ins during Autumn 2 to review progress and set targets for completion of first draft by end of term. Paper 3 – students will continue their study in depth focusing on the Crimean War, 1854–56 and The Second Boer War, 1899–1902. Students will look at the role of the army leaders in bringing about success for the British Army in both wars, and the contributions of other significant individuals e.g. Florence Nightingale. During these topics that students will also look at the increasing role of the press on public opinion at home and the impact this had on the British experience of warfare. This includes essay and source type questions. These units involve an overview of the changes that occur during the period 1793-1918; for example looking at reforms made to the army and navy; the changing role of the navy during the period; recruitment to the armed forces and the role of the populace both in supporting the war effort and financing it.
