Year 12 History Curriculum Overview

Rationale: The Year 12 curriculum covers **P1** – Britain Transformed, 1918-1997 and **P2** – The USA, 1955-92: conformity and challenge. We use the Edexcel exam board. Lessons are geared towards the understanding and completion of exam questions, interpretations, sources and knowledge based questions.

Papers are taught concurrently, 3 lessons per week for P1, 2 lessons per week for P2.
