Year 7 History Curriculum Overview

Rationale: The Year 7 curriculum is designed to give students an understanding of British history from 1066 through to 1500. We begin with the Norman invasion in 1066 followed by the Norman consolidation of power leading to the creation of the medieval state. We look at the feudal system, Domesday book and the use of castles as a mechanism for controlling the indigenous population. We then look at life in the medieval world focusing on issues such as the importance of the Church as a spiritual and political power which challenged the authority of the King. We also look at the problems facing medieval Kings such as the Black Death, the Peasants Revolt and the limits placed on a monarch's power with the King John and the Magna Carta. We also look at the Crusades and the War of the Roses, which sets the scene for Year 8 history which begins with Henry VII, victor at the Battle of Bosworth. We have a final unit with a non-British focus looking at the Renaissance in Florence.
