Year 8 German Curriculum Overview

Rationale for Year group & Skills: In German students will undertake 3 lessons per fortnight. The Year 8 curriculum is designed to teach students how to describe (concrete) places, people and things. Lessons will incorporate the four key literacy skills of reading, writing, speaking and listening and build on and develop their knowledge and grammatical understanding from Year 7. Their knowledge of vocabulary is broadened via the topics of school, holidays and a cultural unit on Berlin , whilst reinforcing key grammatical concepts from Year 7. Students gradually develop their vocabulary from word, sentence and finally text level with these new topics. Students will explore cultural differences between different German speaking countries and regions. There will also be a focus on collaboration, presentation, research and debating skills.

	Knowledge Students will be able to communicate about school by asking and answering questions. They will be able to describe and give opinions about subjects, food, uniform, teachers, and school buildings. A wider range of opinion phrases, including negatives, will be taught and students will be able to justify their opinions applying a variety of new structures. More complex word order will be introduced to explain opinions about their everyday experiences. Verbs from Year 7 will be reinforced in this new topic, whilst introducing a greater variety of verbs taught in the context of the school day. Students will learn to discuss where they go and why, describe the weather and activities they do in different weathers / seasons and places. They will describe what they eat in different countries and be able to complete transactions in restaurants and hotels. This will include asking for information as a tourist and understanding replies. They will be able to explain which mode of transport they prefer and why and with whom they travel (dative case).

Skills

Forming questions, German word order, phonics and applying the imperfect past tense.
Understanding formal / informal language.

Reading, writing, speaking, listening. Every lesson students develop their confidence with pronunciation and intonation when speaking. They will begin to construct longer sentences using a wider range of conjunctions.

This unit of work builds on the work from Autumn 1 and continues to develop collaboration, confidence with oracy and research skills.

Wider experiences

- modes of transport, different weather conditions, activities on holiday.
- Speaking prepare and present a paragraph about holidays including places and reasons for travel, accommodation and transport choice. Comparing different holiday options, giving opinions and reasons for their choices.

Skills for assessment

Speaking - Assessed on pronunciation, intonation and fluency.
