## Year 7 Drama Curriculum Overview

**Rationale:** Drama is studied by all students in Years 7 which they undertake once a week. The Year 7 Drama curriculum is practical and designed to give students an introduction to Drama where they learn Drama strategies for devising and creating performances and develop their performer and design skills. As part of the course we complete activities that help them to build their confidence and resilience, inspire creativity and develop their collaboration skills within the group to create an effective group ensemble.

Autumn 2	Introduction to Drama II This unit of work builds on the work from Autumn I and continues to develop collaboration skills and how to work well in a group. Students continue to learn a range of Drama strategies such as Vocal and Physical Choral Skills and Physical Theatre. Students will have the opportunity to explore the Greek Myth -Oedipus and the Sphinx. Students will also have the opportunity to create a small performance in groups based on a well- known story (The Three Little Pigs) using these strategies' linked to their chosen genre. Shund T	This unit of work focuses on collaboration skills and how to work well in a group. Students listen and follow a radio play where they are introduced to two characters who are journalists. Students will have the opportunity to create and develop role- plays linked to the story of North wood Hall as we follow the story of the journalists. Why does Mrs le-Strange want to sell Northwood Hall? What are the rumours and stories linked to the house? What happened in Northwood Hall the night that Mrs Le- Strange's Uncle died? Students will have the opportunity to create small performances using a range of Drama strategies and creating interesting and believable characters in groups to build up their confidence. Spring 2	<b>Exploring Text The Grimm Tales</b> This unit of work focuses on collaboration skills and how to work well in a group. Students have the opportunity to explore extracts from a play from The Grimm Tales (Hansel and Gretal) and explore line learning and interpreting the script using physical theatre, chorus and props.
