Year 10 Geography Curriculum Overview

Students continue with the second year of their AQA GCSE Geography learning journey. It continues to be studied over the course of five lessons across the fortnight. The topics throughout the year include a combination of human as well as physical topics. The first topic called Physical landscapes in the UK will be a continuation of the topic from the later part of year 9 with a greater focus on Glacial landscapes in the UK rather than Coastal landscapes of the UK. The second topic is called the challenge of natural hazards where students will examine both tectonic and climatic hazards. By the end of year 10 students will have commenced a human Geography topic called Changing Economic World. By the end of year 10 students will have completed a mock examination.

During the summer term students will also have a series of revision lessons in preparation for the summer term 2 year 10 mock exams. Linked to careers whilst learning about how countries can be supported the role of aid agencies and their personnel will be examined.
