

## Year 12 Curriculum Overview

## **Rationale:**

The KS5 curriculum is designed to build on the skills developed in KS4, the focus now is developing a personal style of work. Pupils are taught a number of decoration and construction techniques in a range of workshops at the beginning of the course. A few months in to the course pupils will complete a baseline project from a selection of set tasks. After the base line project pupils will start their Non Exam Assessment (NEA -Component 1) which is worth 60% of their A Level. For Component 1 pupils can choose any topic they wish to study.
