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Dear Parents/Carers,

I write ahead of the long weekend for students away from school to facilitate the staff training day on Monday 28 March. I hope this can be an opportunity to rest and recharge for the remaining two weeks of school this term. Teachers were again pleased with the opportunity to see parents and carers at both the Year 13 and 11 face-to-face subject evenings this term - I know students are now busy preparing for their final exams in each group. We still have a few key events over the coming weeks so please do continue to look at the school calendar, the Year 8 Subject & Options evening and Dance Recital to note a couple.

It has been wonderful to see some of our young people embody our school values with their work in supporting those directly affected by the war in Ukraine. We have spent time during tutorial sessions discussing the crisis, but many young people within our community have done so much more; organising charity events, raising money, donating food and household items and simply showing respect for our global community with gestures of support.

We are awaiting the updated Covid-19 school operating guidance that is due to reflect the national changes from 1 April.
