Lockdown Alarm Practice

As part of our ongoing commitment to ensuring the safety and well-being of all students, we conducted a practice lockdown drill at the school this afternoon. This is part of our regular safeguarding procedures designed to prepare our students and staff in the unlikely event of a critical incident. The lockdown practice was carried out in a calm and controlled manner, with clear instructions given to students to ensure the safety of staff and students.

We understand that these practice events can be unsettling for both students and parents, but we want to reassure you that they are essential for ensuring that our school is prepared and that students know what to do in an emergency. If your child expressed any concern or confusion about the practice, please do not hesitate to contact us, and we will be happy to discuss it further.

Loudmouth Theatre Production

In addition to our ongoing programme of PSHE and safeguarding initiatives, we are pleased to share that our students in years 8 and 10 recently participated in a series of productions hosted by a local theatre company, Loudmouth Education. The programme included a series of performances and workshops, which provided our students with a unique opportunity to explore topics such as consent, harassment and coercive control.

Loudmouth Education is a theatre-in-education company that has been delivering impactful Relationships, Sex, and Health Education (RSHE) for over twenty years. Their programmes play a vital role in supporting safeguarding and relationship education to young people. Their approach is designed to empower young people to understand and manage relationships, recognise harmful behaviours, and make informed decisions for their future.
