Scarlett Fever

The Director of Public Health, Dr Shade Agboola, has written to all educational settings to inform us of persistently high incidents of scarlet fever and invasive group A strep above current seasonal expected levels within the community. I have attached an FAQ sheet should you have any concerns, we here at school work closely with the UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA), reporting incidents as directed and will keep you updated should we have any further information.

We ask

- If any student is diagnosed with scarlet fever/streptococcal infection please contact the school and keep your child at home until 24 hours after commencing appropriate antibiotic treatment.
- Encourage children and young people to implement good hand hygiene practices.
- Encourage children and young people to implement good respiratory hygiene practices.
