Careers in Y7

How school relates to and prepares students for their future career aspirations is a key aspect of the curriculum journey here at NLS. The focus for the Y7 Careers Curriculum is Discovery. As part of the curriculum Year 7 will start to discover answers to the questions:

What is careers?

What is a CV – which skills do I have and which skills do I need to develop?

Why is it important to know about the Labour Market and to challenge stereotypes?

The careers curriculum will take place during tutor time sessions in all three terms. In addition students will have a series of careers focused assemblies and events where they will be able to interact with external providers from both education and employment/training, to discover more about their post-16 choices as well as what the world of work is like.

Online safety

NLS has a policy that precludes the student use of mobile phones on the school site that has been in place for some years now as a consequence of their high level misuse in school. However, we appreciate that parents/carers wish their children to have mobile phones on them for safety reasons as they travel to and from school.

Unfortunately the misuse of mobile phones in the wider lives of young people continues to be an ever increasing issue and we are now looking to provide internet support workshops for parents and more information will be coming out via parent communications. In addition our PHSE curriculum across all year groups does include keeping safe on the internet and healthy relationships, and we would always advise parents monitoring the use of mobile phones.

As we operate a non-mobile phone policy we are unable to monitor social media groups and so this responsibility lies with parents.

We have been made aware that there are multiple apps that students in Year 7 are accessing that are not appropriate for Year 7/8 aged children and they should not have accounts e.g. WhatsApp rating is 16+. Age ratings are there to protect your child and ensure that your child is only accessing apps that are suitable for their age. This should help to reduce any potential risks. It is also important to be aware that it can be the developer that sets the age rating so please review the app yourself. Our primary piece of advice is to take students off of social media sites that they should not be accessing. We would also recommend that you and your child:

















- Use the block and 'report abuse' facility on the relevant social media platform.

- Place time limits on apps and ensure students have a 'digital detox' so they are not spending too much time on social media

PE

Since their arrival at North Leamington School (NLS) students have taken part in a variety of sports activities in mixed-ability groups during their PE lessons. This has enabled the PE staff to assess the sporting ability of all students. Whilst the primary focus of PE is to enable students to be physically active and to hopefully develop a love for one or more sports, we find that it is easier to provide the correct amount of support, challenge, and level of competition by teaching in ability groups. The groups students have now been moved into are very likely to be their groups for the remainder of the academic year, barring exceptional circumstances. Staff will of course move students between groups should it be necessary at a later date.


