

Year 11 Parent Bulletin – Friday 23 February 2024

Dear Parents and Carers,

As the journey and preparations continue for the Summer 2024 examinations continues, I wanted to express my delight in how Year 11 students have conducted themselves during this demanding period. It has also been wonderful to see how engaged students are during lessons, working hard to ensure they are organised and well-equipped for their upcoming final exams. In addition, the recent (and final) mock exams have provided students with the opportunity to apply their knowledge and exam techniques, which they'll get feedback on shortly from their subject teachers. With all the mock exams now complete and with students having experienced receiving their mock GCSE results in an assembly last half term as they would in the summer, all eyes now are on the Summer exams. To continue supporting students with their studies, I would like to remind you of the after-school sessions available to Year 11 students (3:20 – 4:00pm):

All students have been issued a 'Passport to the Prom'. When a student attends a revision session, they can ask their teacher to sign their 'Passport' to confirm their attendance. Not only does this equate to free photographs at Prom, but it may also support students in demonstrating their efforts to attend revision sessions, which in turn will support their efforts to place themselves in the 'Green' category of the Celebration Day criteria (see below).

Year 11 Celebration Day – Monday 8 July 2024

Whilst the Summer exams should be the focus for all students, planning is taking place in the background to organise the Year 11 Celebration Day on Monday 8 July. In keeping with past traditions, this will consist of shirt signing, the distribution of Leavers Hoodies and Year Books, and (a final!) celebration assembly within school. The day concludes with the Year 11 Prom. Whilst we would like all students to attend and celebrate the past five years, it has been stressed to students that this will be by invitation only, with the following criteria regularly shared with students:

As there are five areas of criteria, the overall category will be determined on an average basis. The above criteria has been applied to the past two half terms (Autumn 2, and Spring 1) and where students have not fallen into the 'green' category, students will be informed where specifically they need to show improvements. Parents/Carers will also be notified by letter where this is the case.

This half term (up until Easter) is the final opportunity for students to give themselves the best possible chance of being successful by attending and being punctual to school, demonstrating excellent behaviour and attitude in lessons attending additional revision/intervention sessions, and are wearing their full uniform at all times. I hope you will agree that the criteria to earn an invite to the Celebration Day events is not an unreasonable expectation especially for students about to undertake their GCSE examinations.

More information will be shared regarding the Celebration Day after Easter, including purchasing tickets for the Prom.
