RE Mock Results

Following Year 10 students sitting their RE mock before the October half term, their exam paper and the grade achieved have now been shared with students and are available on G4S for parents/carers to view.

I would like to take this opportunity to congratulate all the students who committed to sitting their first Religious Education mock exam. We are incredibly proud of the way they prepared themselves and approached this important milestone with determination and focus.

Some students performed exceptionally well, and their results reflect the hard work and effort they have put into their studies. We are fortunate to have gained valuable insights from the mock, enabling us to identify areas where additional support and intervention can be provided for those who may be disappointed or who underachieved.

It is important to remember that mocks are not just an assessment of knowledge at a specific point in time, they serve as a powerful tool for highlighting strengths and addressing gaps. It is a great opportunity to see what has been understood and where the gaps in knowledge still exist, so they can be closed, ready for the next Mock Paper in February. There is still plenty of time to fine-tune the exam technique for all our students to achieve their target grade and beyond. Learning is a journey and nothing is over until that final terminal paper in June 2025.

By tailoring support to meet each student's unique needs, we can ensure they are fully equipped to achieve their best when it matters most.
