Dear Parents, Carers

I hope you are well and enjoyed the recent sunshine!

This letter contains some key reminders as well as pointers for things you need to be aware of.

1. Future Pathways Launch

This full day event takes place on Wednesday, June 17. It is an opportunity to understand what post-18 options are available to your children. It is generic in places but also specific and personalised – with, for example, sessions tailored to high demand subjects and organisations. It also covers literacy support in order to write strong applications to whatever next step destination your child is targeting.

For the personalised sessions, students can choose to be given guidance on one of the following:

- Oxford and Cambridge applications
- Veterinary Science applications
- Medical Degree applications
- Conservatoire applications
- Law and LNAT applications

If students do not select one of these, there are in a more-generic session for standard applications.

Please do check in with your child to ensure they have responded to Miss Short's MS Form if they are wanting to be in a more-personalised (Oxbridge, Medicine etc) session.

2. Work Experience

The vast, vast majority of Y12 students are now all but sorted for their placement. We have written targeted letters to the parents of those who still have not secured a quality placement and hope everyone can enjoy a quality placement – there is a 'safety net' option we have referenced in the targeted letter but are hoping students can access something a bit more person-specific and in-person. We are grateful for everyone's support in ensuring this is a successful initiative and supports future applications.

3. World Class Basics

Just a gentle reminder for parents to please continue to support us in ensuring students adhere to the World Class Basics: on punctuality, attendance, Dress Code and device usage.

In particular, we are appreciative of the efforts made to ensure a very strong start to the new mobile phone policy. Please see previous communications from Mr Lowdell and Ms Jones and recall key points for Sixth Formers such as the need to have mobiles away in a bag the moment they are outside of one of the 'privileged use' zones: study rooms, Common Room, Mezzanine.
