Students discovered that Health and Social Care careers can lead to a wide range of job roles such as speech and language therapist, chiropractor, social worker, psychologist and much much more.

Students had the opportunity to gain an understanding of topics covered in Business Studies such as business concepts and skills involved in running a small business e.g. finance, liability, laws, tax, inflation, interest rates, exchange rates, government impact, marketing, logistics, finance and human resources. They also learnt about the importance of using business models, theories and techniques to support analysis of contemporary business issues. Students were encouraged to consider the impact of the wider world such as globalisation, ethical issues and global economy.
